The Bega Valley Innovation Hub, supported by the University of Wollongong and iAccelerate, is opening its doors to the business community, offering a free work space to any business that is directly or indirectly affected by the bushfires.

We invite businesses to experience the benefit of education and co-working alongside our entrepreneurs, mentors, and industry experts. You will be able to connect and collaborate with other local businesses that are also sharing the impact of the bushfires, and share your challenges.

We will be offering 10 temporary, free co-working spaces, with modern desks, meeting facilities and internet connectivity for those businesses affected either directly or indirectly by the bushfires across our region.
